Greetings Brethren. I apologize for the delay of the Trestleboard, life gets in the way sometimes. Before commencing, I want to give a special thanks to MW Francis R. Mitchell for his elucidation on the history of the Prince Hall Lodges at our regular communication in April.

We just concluded the 224th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge. Some of the highlights, the 19th district again sponsored a Hospitality Suite, it was very successful, I think everyone enjoyed it and had fun. Special thanks to WB P. Brian Siez and our own SW Kevin Ryan and SMC Scott Daley. We also elected a new Junior Grand Warden, RW Gerald J. Sharpe, congratulations to him, well deserved. There were a number of Constitution and By-Laws proposals voted on, the most prominent one, where there has been numerous discussions in the past was Title 4, Section 5, part 3(C). The change was approved and now reads:

“A Trustee may also hold an appointive office in the lodge to which he has been elected a Trustee. A Trustee may not hold an elective office nor serve on the audit committee in the lodge to which he has been elected Trustee.” During the pro and con discussions I asked for a clarification on the title of Trustee, since most lodges have Hall or Temple Trustees as well as Lodge Trustees. The MW Joseph H. Rival, informed us that this would apply to all Trustees, that there is no distinction for the purpose of this legislation.

There were also three legislation changes to Title 5, General Regulation 20, 21, and 22. These having to do with reading and approving bills at lodge before payment, unless impractical, then the WM may act on behalf of the lodge. Also, annual audits to be conducted on the lodge, Craftsman Club, or any other Association.

There were a number of proposed legislations having to do with assessments to the lodge, all of which passed.

The most contentious one was a proposal to lower the age for petition from 21 to 18. This proposal was defeated.

This coming month we have our Gold Token Night on the 19th. WB Bernie Berkowitz is one of the recipients. We also have a wheel chair push on the 29th and the Riverside Memorial Parade on the 30th. We have also scheduled a Lodge work day on May 14th and another work day on June 11th. Please make a special effort to participate in all of these. Thank you.

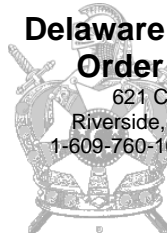

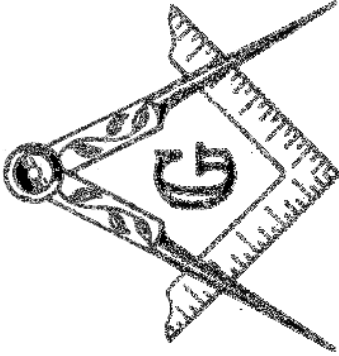
